## 24-HOUR HOTLINE



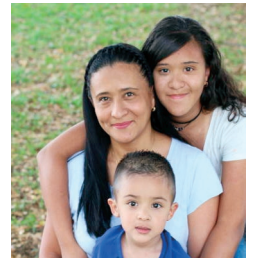
We're here 24/7 for battered women, friends and family and other agencies - to listen, talk, validate, discuss, refer, plan - and to listen.

## SUPPORT GROUP



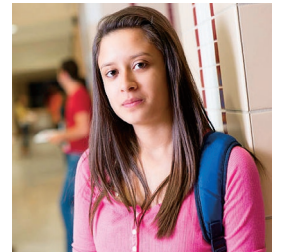
Each week, women come together for an hour to share their stories, gain insight and support. And realize just how personal and yet how universal their experiences are.

## TEEN PROGRAM

We go into classrooms, teaching our 2 day Dating Violence Curriculum for girls and boys. As one 7th grade boy said, *“It taught me how to treat girls nice.”*
